David L. Smith, born in Ottumwa, Iowa on June 13, 1951, passed away in Chicago on January 14th, 2011, after a nine-month battle with lung cancer at the age of 59. David received his AA degree from Ottumwa Heights College of Iowa (1973), his BA and BS degrees from the University of Chicago in 1997. David married Rebecca Gray Schmidt on November 5th, 1988. He was employed as a supervisor in the City of Chicago Department of Law, Aviation, and Environment & Regulatory Division from 1991 until his death. His primary projects with the city were the O'Hare Airport Modernization and the Chicago River Clean-up; he had a passion for statistics and the social sciences, and used his extensive knowledge to serve the citizens of the City of Chicago. David and Rebecca were active members of the Field Museum of Chicago, the Chicago Shakespeare Theatre, and the Art Institute of Chicago.

David is survived by; his spouse Rebecca Gray Schmidt Smith, his daughter, Katrina Smith Beeston, his grandchildren Robert Alexander Beeston and Haley Morgan Beeston, and his cousins Elizabeth Coble and Isabel Coble Stubbs. His parents, Icephine Marie Ruby Smith and John Michael Smith preceded him in death. His cremated remains will be distributed in select locations of: Chicago, England, France and Belgium, as per his

wishes.
