



## Homer Hynick

September 23, 1919 - September 3, 2002

Homer Hynick was born in Eddyville, Iowa to Andy Hynick and Mary Gutch Hynick. He was united in marriage to Lillian Lappin on July 15, 1942 in Macon, Missouri. In his early years he farmed near Eddyville, and in 1951 he moved to a farm south of Fremont where he farmed for 38 years. Homer also worked in sales for Courtney Shepherd Implement for 17 years and for Roland Brothers, Wymore and Bean, and Albert Caves Garage as a mechanic. He is survived by his wife Lillian, three daughters; Nancy Stoos of Muscatine, Iowa, Barbara Krusemark of Ottumwa, Iowa, and Diana Bokhoven of New Sharon, Iowa, one son; Neil Hynick of Hatley, Wisconsin; 9 grandchildren, 12 great-grandchildren, 2 step great-grandchildren, and one half brother, Paul Hynick of Eddyville, Iowa. He attended the Wilson Country School and graduated from Eddyville. Homer's activities included racing go carts, participating in tractor pulls, playing pool, traveling, and being a "perfectionist". He also enjoyed driving through the countryside. He was a member of the Fremont United Methodist Church and was a past member of the Fremont Lions Club.
