Linda Karen Shaw Shultz, 67, went to be with the Lord on January 31, 2009. Linda was born to Waldo and Mildred Shaw on January 9, 1942, in Hedrick, Iowa. Following her education, she married Ed Shultz and during their marriage they lived in Iowa, Michigan, Massachusetts, and Tennessee.

lasting memories with friends, and working on charitable events. She was always looking for ways to serve others.

In every community that Linda lived, she was active in the church, community events, and charitable organizations. If there was an event to organize, she was usually the one leading it.
